**CURRICULAR
DISTINCTIVES:**

Brazos Christian School offers a college preparatory education from a Biblical worldview based on universal truths, foundational principles, enduring traditions, and the great literature of history taught in a multi-sensory, integrated format. Brazos Christian School humanities program focuses on an intensive study of great writings, people, events, works, and ideas that have formed and reformed civilization as we know it. Normative works of our culture are studied within their historical settings. This helps the students understand how the works, and the people who wrote them, were influenced by their times. It also reveals the universal nature of the great works, which are classics because they speak to all men at all times. The courses are organized chronologically, moving from ancient civilizations to modern times. Emphasis is placed upon reading, writing, and speaking skills.

GPA COMPUTATION:

Each student has a cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA) calculated based upon high school credit courses taken at Brazos Christian School and based upon a 4.0 scale. Since the school is selective in admission, rank in class is of little significance in predicting success in college. Our strength is such that all of our students have a solid academic foundation and are well-prepared to perform in a demanding college environment. Therefore, we do not rank; however, we do weight classes. DC denotes a Dual Credit course taken through either Blinn College or Colorado Christian University and is given a weight of 1.0. H denotes an Honors level course and is given a weight of 0.5.
